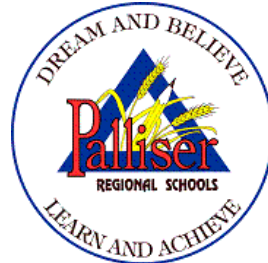
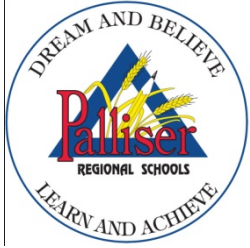

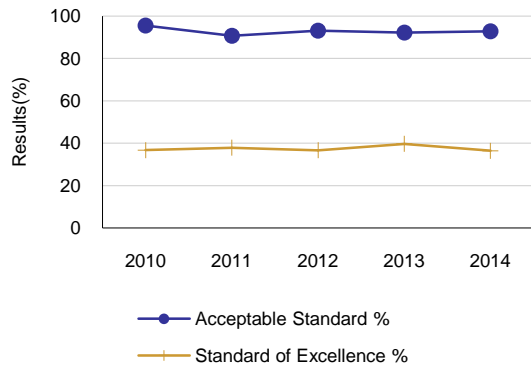

<p><i>Literacy</i></p> <p>Students will improve their reading skills.</p>	<p>Use Fountas and Pinnell data to determine improvement in reading level.</p>	<p>Susan Bowen, the literacy lead teacher, will provide staff 'standard setting' session to ensure consistency in testing.</p> <p>All students 2-6 will have an F & P assessment completed by Oct 10, 2014 (grade 1 by Nov 21/14).</p> <p>Teachers will use F & P results to group intervention students according to two main areas: comprehension and accuracy, and work in small groups and one-to-one with these students.</p> <p>Continued training and practice provided by Susan Bowen and Bev Smith with the use of balanced literacy materials for grades 1 -6.</p>	
<p>Students will work toward improving their writing skills.</p>	<p>Grade 6 PAT results to be reviewed.</p> <p>Common assessments will be developed at each grade level to appropriately assess writing.</p>	<p>PAT analysis of June 2014 results will be completed in fall of 2014. 	Instructional supervision will indicate that common language is used.	<p>framework for writing instruction.</p> <p>CAFE strategies will be employed at teachers' discretion.</p> <p>Assessed writing samples from each grade level (1-6) will be handed in monthly to administration from November to May. This practice will allow administration to view student work, note inconsistency in grade level assessments, and inform “look fors” when doing instructional supervision.</p> <p>Instructional supervision templates and post-observation discussions will monitor the use of common language.</p> <p>5 step plan for literacy developed at Literacy Symposium will be implemented throughout the next 3 years, with teachers focusing on what their responsibilities are. Administration team will look for evidence of implementation during observations. Staff will share at staff meetings and site PD days their progress.</p>

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Graph of Overall Provincial Achievement Test Results

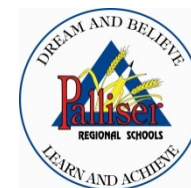
