Secondary Expansion Project - Next Steps. The CSCE Board **continues** to gather feedback on the results of our February 27 special resolution vote. We ask that current parents respond to this <u>SURVEY</u> to share their insights and suggestions. Please complete the survey by Friday, March 15.

CSCE Board Nominees and Election - The Board Development Committee has begun vetting nominees in preparation of the election being held during the **CSCE Annual General Meeting (AGM) May 21.** As a reminder, members will be electing three (3) new members to the Board of Directors.

Why are we electing three (3) new members? The CSCE by-laws provide for a minimum of 5 and maximum of 9 members of the Board of Directors. In recent years, we have had an inconsistent turnover in the number of directors. Last year there was only a single vacancy; this year there are four (4) Board members whose terms are ending, namely Jon Halford, Matt Weening, Michelle Zuk, and Olugbenga Adebayo. To improve Board of Director transitions - including retaining Board member knowledge and assisting new members in getting up to speed as Directors, the Board is working towards achieving an annual turnover of three (3) Board members in each given year. Based on current and projected director terms, it will only take a couple cycles to get back to the turnover of three (3) Board members. This could be as early as 2026.
