Assurance Framework

The Assurance Framework is a new system Alberta Education uses to ensure all schools are providing the best possible education. It focuses on five key areas:

- 1. Student Growth and Achievement, ensuring students are continuously learning and succeeding;
- 2. Teaching and Leading, emphasizing quality teaching and leadership;
- 3. Learning Supports, creating supportive and inclusive environments;
- 4. Governance, ensuring effective management and decision-making; and

5. Local and Societal Context, adapting to the unique needs of our community. This approach provides focus as we track our school's progress, improve education quality, and maintain transparency and accountability.

Within each of these key areas, the Palliser school division has outlined what success would look like through the <u>desired states</u>. In partnership with the Calgary Society for Christian Education, we work together as we pursue the desired states here at Calgary Christian Secondary School alongside an experience integrated with our Christian faith.

Our Assurance Measure Results

Within the 306 pages found in the link above, the following key takeaways emerge:

Student Learning Engagement: The student learning engagement measure is 83.2%, aligning closely with the provincial average of 83.7%. This remains an area to explore innovative approaches to deepen engagement further.	Safe & Caring Environment: Satisfaction with the school's welcoming, caring, respectful, and safe learning environments (WCRSLE) is at 87.8%, exceeding the provincial average. This highlights the school's commitment to fostering an inclusive and supportive atmosphere.	High School Completion Rates: The school's 5-year high school completion rate is 98.5%, significantly above the provincial average of 88.1%. The 3-year completion rate of 90.7% also surpasses the provincial result of 80.4%, reflecting long-term success and preparation for future pathways.	Provincial Achievement Tests (PAT) & Diploma Exam Results: Grade 9 PAT results show 87.9% achieving the acceptable standard compared to the provincial average of 62.5%, and 32.4% achieving excellence compared to 15.4% provincially. Diploma Exam results similarly highlight 91.1% achieving the acceptable standard compared to 81.5% provincially, and 34.2% achieving excellence compared to 22.6%.	Parental Involvement and Community Engagement: Parental involvement is at 87.4%, significantly higher than the provincial average of 79.5%, demonstrating strong collaboration and engagement with families.
Support for Citizenship Development: Citizenship ratings are at 83.9%, well above the provincial average of 79.4%. Continuing to integrate service-learning and community-focused initiatives can strengthen this core value.	Enhancing Access to Supports and Services: The measure for access to supports and services is 85.5%, compared to the provincial average of 79.9%. While higher than average, there is an opportunity to explore additional resources and services for students.	Experiential Learning Excellence: Field trips, performing arts, and service opportunities remain central to the school's approach, providing real-world experiences and fostering well-rounded development.	Improvement Evaluation: The school's performance is assessed not just in terms of current results but also in comparison to past performance, with most areas showing maintained or improved status.	Survey Responses: Data on the percentage of teachers, parents, and students who agree that students are engaged in their learning at school is included, with the majority indicating agreement.

If we compare our school to provincial averages, the following insights were noted:

Overall, CCS is performing well, often exceeding provincial averages. The results suggest that CCS is providing a high-quality educational experience, with particular strengths in fostering academic success, creating a safe and caring environment, and engaging the community. However, there are areas where our school can still seek to improve, such as program access - a measure of satisfaction with the accessibility, effectiveness and efficiency of programs and services for students in their community.

The CCS <u>Brand Story</u>, <u>Educational Vision and Philosophy</u>, and our <u>CCS Values</u> present a framework for holistic Christian education focusing on academic, emotional, physical, social, and spiritual development. Together they emphasize integration of faith into all aspects of education, aiming to develop students who will actively serve and positively impact the world.

Though the Alberta Education Assurance Measures serve as a baseline for certain aspects of academic and performance, these standard metrics do not fully capture the distinctly Christian vision CCS holds as a measure for success. As we prepare to share our artifacts of learning, we do so hoping to highlight our broader vision that extends beyond academic achievement alone.
